Hal and Jackie Williams have always had a heart for children. In the early days of a small effort in behalf of orphaned children in Guatemala they become charter supporters of what would become International Children's Care (ICC). A friend told Hal that he could set up an irrevocable trust with the proceeds from the sale. This trust would go to benefit worthy causes. In addition, the Williams' would be able to use the interest from the trust to provide for their own needs. Being long-time supporters of ICC, Hal and Jackie realized that in establishing such a trust, the children of ICC would receive a tremendous blessing.




Without much further consideration, Hal and Jackie set about taking the necessary steps to set up the trust.
